ORDER

Before the Court is a Motion For Admission *Pro Hac Vice*, filed July 31, 2015 (Clerk’s Dkt. No. 28). By way of the motion, Edward T. Hinson, Jr. (“Hinson”), counsel for defendant Philip E. Gaucher, seeks leave to appear *pro hac vice* in this action.

Hinson states in his motion that he is a member in good standing of the Bar of the State of North Carolina. Hinson additionally states he has read and will comply with the Local Rules, including those governing the conduct of attorneys. Thus, the Court finds that Hinson should be admitted *pro hac vice* to represent the defendant.

Accordingly, the Motion For Admission *Pro Hac Vice* (Clerk’s Dkt. No. 28) is hereby **GRANTED**. The Court therefore GRANTS Hinson permission to appear *pro hac vice* in this case. The Court ORDERS that Hinson, if he has not already done so, shall immediately tender the amount of \$100.00 made payable to: Clerk, United States District Court, in compliance with Local Rule AT-1(f)(2). The Court further notes, pursuant to Administrative Policies and Procedures for Electronic Filing in Civil and Criminal Cases in the Western District of Texas, attorneys admitted

to practice *pro hac vice* must register as filing users within ten (10) days of this Order.
